FUN BOARD RAISES BUS ASSISTANCE- to \$50 per person, up to 40 people on your bus, or, up to the cost of your bus. Example, 40 people on the bus equals \$2000. The bus cost \$1450, FUN pays \$1450.

BUS TRIP to Summer FUN- Get your Bus Assistance Application into Katie Williams by June 1st. FUN re-imburses your club \$50 a per person up to 40 people on your bus. Minimum 20 people on a bus. The application is at <u>www.funtopic.com</u> Click "Summer FUN" and scroll down the to "Club Bus Trip App."

IMPORTANT- Some of the FUN officers and board members are nearing the end of their career on the FUN board. We need FUN coin club members to step up and run for the FUN Board.
