BUS TRIP to Summer FUN- Get your Bus Assistance Application into Katie Williams by June 1st. FUN re-imburses your club \$50 a per person up to 40 people on your bus. Minimum 20 people on a bus. The application is at www.funtopic.com Click "Summer FUN" and scroll down the to "Club Bus Trip App."

IMPORTANT- Some of the FUN officers and board members are nearing the end of their career on the FUN board. We need FUN coin club members to step up and run for the FUN Board. This is a volunteer position and you would have to work at the FUN shows, however there are perks to the position such as First Class Hotel Room during the show and at board meetings, per diem, transportation costs covered, possible travel to a regional or national show where most of the expenses are covered, and meeting the principles of national numismatic magazines and organizations where you might make a special deal for your local coin club.
